There are two parts to the auction: a Vocal auction and a Silent auction. Vocal auction items are listed first in this catalog, followed by the Silent auction items. Silent auction items are grouped into these categories:

- **Tangibles.** The range of items available is so diverse as to defy description
- **Services** that draw upon the talents of our congregation
- **Gift Cards and Tickets** to local establishments. Provided by congregation members or by the businesses themselves.
- **Food.** Unique offerings by members of the congregation, many of which have a mighty reputation so be prepared for aggressive bidding.
- **Fixed Price Signups.** All you have to do is put your name on the list. Some events are space limited so be sure to visit this part of the auction early. The Fixed Price category includes movies and many family oriented, modest price, events.

- **UUCC Creations** -- items designed, created or handcrafted by our UUCC community.

It is highly recommended that you review this catalog and prepare your bidding strategy before auction night. The action during the Vocal auction will be fast and furious. To assist you in finding items and events that you will be interested in, quick reference guides have been prepared and appear before the detailed item descriptions.

SPONSORS: Some of the gift certificates and some services for the auction were donated by local establishments. We thank them and encourage you to show your thanks through your patronage.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE SILENT AUCTION

- **To Bid:** Enter your name, paddle number and (for bid-up items) the bid price. **If you wish to increase your bid on a bid-up item, you MUST enter a fresh bid on a fresh line.** Bids must appear on bid sheets in increasing order of the bid price in order for auctioneers to correctly determine winners. If you overwrite or erase an earlier bid, your bid will be disqualified.
- **Multiple buyers.** Some silent auction items can have more than one buyer. To satisfy the most bidders and provide a consistent price for all buyers, items will be awarded to bidders in descending order of bid amount until the quantity is exhausted. The final price will be the mean (average) of the winning bids.
- **Quantity:** If you wish to purchase more than one of the item, indicate the quantity in the designated column.
- **Average price:** The final price may be modestly higher than some winning bids. You may elect to NOT pay the average price (and not receive the item) by placing a check mark under the NO column on the bid sheet.
- **Duplicate bids:** In the event of duplicate bids, priority is given to the first bidder.
- **A sample bid sheet will be on display at the auction for your reference.**
- **Questions?** If you have any questions about bidding on Silent Auction Items, please ask the Silent Auction Coordinator, Randy Raymond.

EVERYTHING HAS TO LEAVE THE BUILDING ON SATURDAY NIGHT!

- **Donors:** Before you leave, check all your donations and take away whatever didn't sell. Do not leave unsold items.
- **Buyers:** Check all your bids to see if you won. Post-it notes will be placed on the tables indicating the winning paddle number. **DO NOT TAKE THE ITEM** unless your paddle number is shown on the note. If you won, take it with you.

Non-reimbursement and Tax Deductibility

Non-reimbursement: Occasionally we get requests to reimburse a Donor for an expense associated with an auction item. It is the UUCC Auction policy NOT to reimburse such expenses. However, these expenses may be tax deductible.

Tax Deductibility:

- a) The amount of the purchase price of an auction item that is deductible for federal income tax purposes is the excess, if any, of the item's purchase price over its Fair Market Value (FMV).
- b) In this catalog, UCC has provided potential purchasers of items with a good faith estimate of the FMV of each item. This estimate has no bearing on the donor or on the final auction price.
- c) For additional guidance on tax deductibility, buyers and donors may consult applicable IRS publications (available on-line) and/or consult an accountant.

WHAT HAPPENS AFTER THE AUCTION

- Buyers' statements will be available between services on the next two Sundays. They also will be available through the UCC office.
- Please pay the amount due as soon as possible.
- Buyers should examine their statements immediately and bring any problems to the attention of the Auction Committee for adjustment. Auction Committee representatives will be in the lobby between services Nov 11 and Nov. 18 to accept payments, to answer questions about statements, and make any necessary adjustments. After that, you can contact them at auktion@uucolumbia.net.
- Donors will receive statements approximately 1-2 weeks after the auction by e-mail listing who purchased their items. This statement will include buyers' contact information. Donors: PLEASE do not discard this e-mail - it is your link to your buyers.
- Unsold seats to events can be purchased after the auction on a first come basis. A list of events with available seats will be posted on the auction website approximately four weeks after the auction.
- **Postponements: If you're a donor**, please make every effort to hold auction events on the scheduled date, postponing only when it is unavoidable. It can avoid problems if you provide rain/snow dates when submitting your donation, particularly for events to be held in wintertime. If you do have to reschedule, it is your responsibility to inform all buyers as soon as possible. Please try to reschedule on a date that most people are comfortable with. **If you're a buyer**, please understand that auction donors are members of your UCC community, and occasionally may have to reschedule an event due to extraordinary circumstances such as snowstorms and illnesses. They will make every effort to avoid changing event dates. If your event does get postponed and you're unable to make the new date, we are sorry that we cannot credit you for the item. You can often find a substitute to attend in your place - people often find that using the listserv or Facebook group can be helpful. If your event is postponed and you don't get follow-up from the donor(s), please reach out to them, and contact the Auction Committee at auktion@uucolumbia.net if you can't reach the donor(s).
- **Cancellations, Donor responsibilities:** If your event must be cancelled altogether, you may want to try to provide a substitute experience. If an event must be cancelled and no substitute event is provided, contact your list of 'purchasers' and the Auction Committee at auktion@uucolumbia.net as soon as possible to let them know.
- **Cancellations, Buyer responsibilities:** Once in a great while an event may have to be cancelled altogether - if so, your donors will try to make a creative effort to provide a substitute event. Please work with your donor to achieve a win-win experience for all. If you receive word that an event has to be cancelled, you can request a credit of your donation amount to be applied to the next upcoming Auction. You need to request the credit as soon as possible, and in any event at least seven days prior to the next Auction. To make the request, email the Auction Team at auktion@uucolumbia.net.
